Introduction to Woodturning (Beginner)

This fun and informative class is a basic introduction to woodturning. Included in the course will be shop safety, sharpening, and tool usage. Students will be working on various projects with an emphasis on bowl-turning. Those new to the lathe will gain confidence in their skills as they learn to create useful items using both wet and dry wood. Each person is sure to have several nice projects to take home at the end of the course.

Ring and keepsake wood boxes with fitted lids will be the objective of this course. Topics include lathe safety, tool selection and use, and sharpening, as well as project design and finishing. Explore inlays and texturing techniques to create decorative and functional pieces of fine woodworking. Some previous turning experience is recommended.
