



Phlebotomy

Foothills Higher Education Center (FHEC), Room 131

This program prepares the graduate to draw blood specimens from patients for the purpose of testing and analyzing blood and all duties related to the preparation and maintenance of the specimens, equipment, and paperwork. A criminal background check prior to your clinical training is now required by Blue Ridge Healthcare. Should a clinical facility deny clinical training to a student, the student will not be permitted to remain in the program. The criminal background check will be done on the first week of the class FREE to the student.

Requirements:

- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Copies of a valid Driver's License and Social Security card (names must match)
- Copy of High School Diploma or GED or sealed transcript of grades.

Additional class information:

- During the last six weeks of class a minimum of 40 outside clinical hours will be scheduled.
- **Criminal** background check during the first week of class.
- Physical Examination -
 - Students are responsible for the cost of the exam and any associated lab or immunizations required.
 - Students may pick up the physical exam form during registration.
 - Every attempt must be made to have the physical exam form completed by the first day of class.
 - The hepatitis B (series of 3 injections) is required by anyone working in healthcare. If you have begun or completed the Hepatitis B series, please attach documents to the health form.
