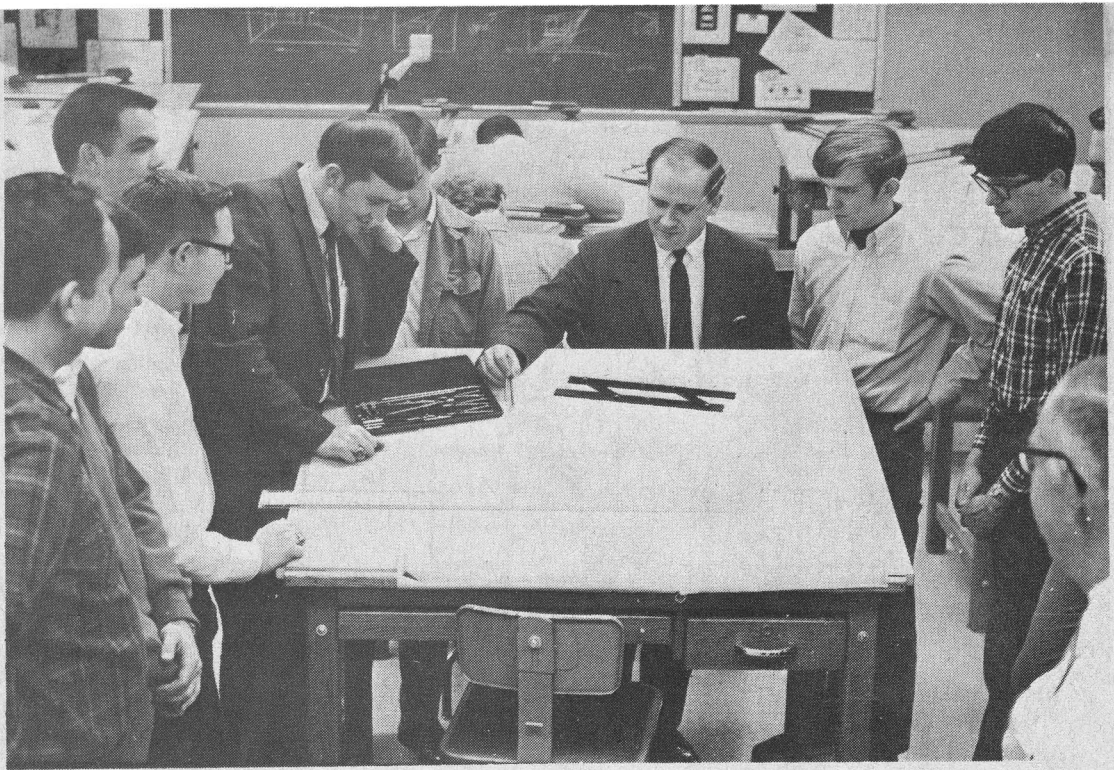




Typical Class In Drafting

3 Drafting Programs To Be Offered

Three programs in drafting will be offered this fall in the mechanical drafting department at Western Piedmont Community College. These programs have three different types of people in mind:

1. The mechanical drafting diploma program, a one-year course is designed for the recent high school graduate or any one desiring to go into drafting as a career; This program is primarily a one-year program, however, the program can be completed in two years on a part-time basis.

2. The mechanical drafting certificate program. This program enables the individual to take courses in drafting only, without participating in the related courses of math, science, etc.

3. The blueprint reading program. This program is designed for the full-time worker who needs to be able to read blueprints as well as be able to do basis drawings and technical sketches.

These courses are offered with the student's needs in mind. In order to help the student with his progress in the programs, the classes will

be kept small enough to give enough individual help, in other words anyone needing help can receive it.
