

New art

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courses at WPCC

Three new art courses will be offered at Western Piedmont Community College for the Spring quarter.

Two of the courses, Introduction to Printmaking and Introduction to Ceramics (pottery), will meet March 3-25. The third course is the New York Museum tour scheduled for March 22-27.

The printmaking course introduces techniques of relief, intaglio and stencil and places an emphasis on visual quality of the printed surface.

According to Raymond Goodfellow, instructor in the art program, the ceramics course is a studio course that provides instruction in the basic pottery forming processes such as coil, slab, pinch and wheel, and includes a study of the nature of clay and glaze.

The printmaking course is offered from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. or 6 to 9 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays. The ceramics course will be taught from 6 to 9 p.m. Mondays and Wednesdays.

Goodfellow said the museum tour provides a unique and rewarding opportunity to experience art and art history at a very economical cost. Transportation to New York and lodging will cost approximately \$200.

While in New York, Goodfellow will conduct guided tours through the Modern Museum of Art, the Metropolitan Museums of Art, Freer Gallery, Whitney Museum of Art and Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum.

The group will leave Western Piedmont at 10 p.m. March 22 and return Sunday, March 27. Transportation will be by commercial bus. Enrollment in the course is limited to 46 and is open to WPCC students, faculty and the general public.
