Mrs. DiSanto's poems are given the following introduction:

"Born in Derby, Conn., in 1924, Mrs. DiSanto was a journalist before moving to North Carolina in 1961. She is a graduate of Belmont Abbey College in Belmont, N.C., and lives in Morgantown, (sic) N.C., with her husband and three children.

"She has studied with James Dickey in his poetry workshop and has published over 160 of her poems in various publications. "The Eye is Single," her first collection, was judged the best collection of poetry published in North Carolina in 1982.

"She teaches poetry at Western Piedmont Community College and in the "Poetry in the Schools" program."

The works of Mrs. DiSanto which are included in the anthology are "In Defense of Plath, Berryman, Sexton," "Last Supper" and "The Eye is Single."
