

WPCC schedules Kite Day

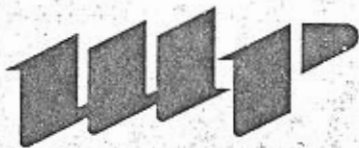

Hospice training

"Hospice Volunteer Training," offered by the Division of Continuing Education at Western Piedmont, will give you insights into the grief reaction and how it feels to lose a family member.

You will encounter death and dying at a personal level. Basic listening skills will be developed for use with dying patients, and you'll examine the role of pain management. Funeral arrangement procedures and the role of the Hospice volunteer with the patient and family will also be explored.

The course, which began Thursday night, will run for nine weeks from 7-9 p.m. each week. It will be held at the Morganton/Burke Senior Center at 501 North Green St.
