

Students to put on talent show at WPCC

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A variety of student talent will be displayed on the campus of Western Piedmont Community College on Thursday, April 16.

Beginning at 7 p.m. in Moore Auditorium, students will have a chance to recite poetry, see modern dance and watch original plays and scripts.

In addition, art will be displayed.

"This is the first time WPCC has ever attempted something like this," said Ted Pope, coordinator for the event and student at the college. "Some of the students that attend the college have never had a forum to express themselves like this before."

The theme of the night will be "Original Faces," taken from a

poem that Pope himself wrote.

"Everyone goes different places in society," he said. "And everywhere we go — be it home, school, work or out with friends, we wear a different face. The whole theme of the night is be yourself."

Several solo artists will also be on hand to provide entertainment and express themselves.

"We will have several varieties of music," Pope said. "We will have folk music, jazz, some contemporary christian music — all different kinds."

Pope says the college has been very helpful in assisting with the organization of the day and said he hopes students who are thinking about attending WPCC in the future will come to the event and see what opportunities are available.
