

WPCC offers 'The Guys' in honor of 9/11 heroes

MORGANTON—The drama program of Western Piedmont Community College's Division of Humanities and Social Sciences will present a staged reading performance of "The Guys," at 3 p.m. Sunday.

Written by Anne Nelson, a former journalist, "The Guys" recounts the true story of an afternoon meeting that occurred a few days after the September 11th terrorist attack in 2001, when Nelson helped a New York City fire captain write eulogies for the eight men he lost. This short,

two-person play is a moving and uplifting piece that celebrates the lives of the heroes lost on that day 10 years ago.

Deborah Lonon, drama coordinator, and Neal Bevans, paralegal instructor, will read the roles of Joan and Nick.

Admission is free, with a suggested donation of \$10. All donations collected will go to the Burke County Firefighters and the Lt. Kelly Kincaid Emergency Services Scholarship at the college. The performance runs approximately 80 minutes with no intermission.

Space in the drama studio in Phifer Learning Resources Center is limited.
