

# Registration Is Brisk For College Courses

Registration is now going on for the college parallel evening program at Western Piedmont Community College and officials of the school are pleased at the interest shown in early registration.

Registration began last night at old Central School and will continue tonight from 7 until 9 o'clock.

"We had a good turn out last night," commented David A. Harris, chairman of the Department of Social Sciences and program director for the college parallel evening classes.

"We had approximately 140 students registering for one or more courses last evening," said Davis. He noted that no student is allowed to take more than three courses in the program and that some of the courses offered have either filled up or are close to being filled.

"There were 120 students who went through the entire process of registration in the first hour. An additional 20 students registered during the last part of the evening," he said.

Davis noted that great interest was shown in the classes in accounting, shorthand, freshman English, and psychology.

These as well as the other courses offered are on both the freshman and sophomore college levels.

"Our community has shown considerable interest in the college's evening program so that we have plans for offering additional courses later in even wider areas of study," he said.

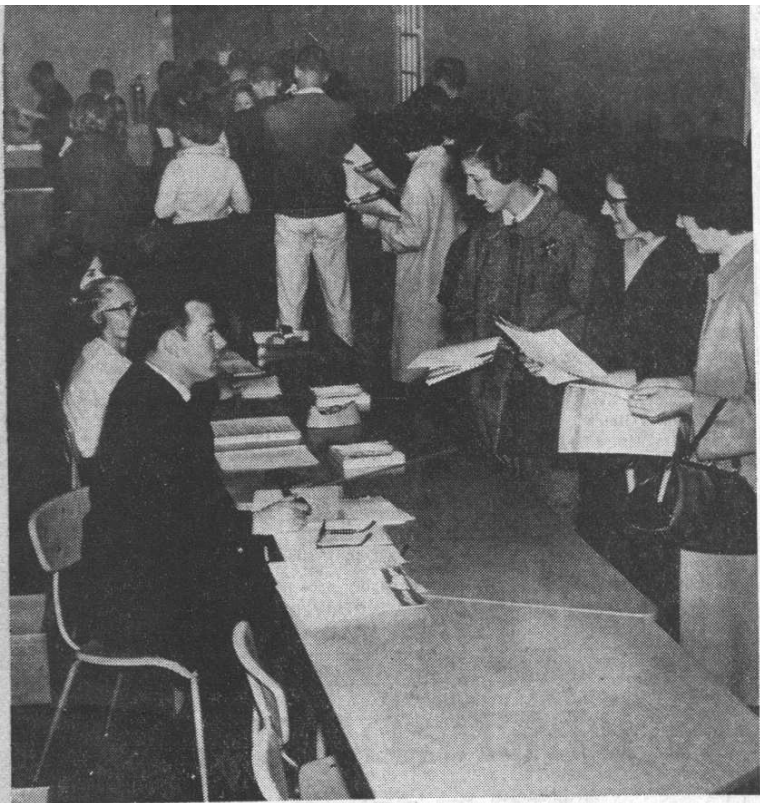
Those registering last night included both recent high school graduates and older persons. Many were making use of the classes as a chance for review in their chosen fields.
